

Safety Requirements for Stage Performers & Stage Hypnotists

Stage

- Make sure area is clear of loose cables. Have the venue personnel responsible for your area tape or lay down carpet if necessary.
- Make sure stairs are secure.
- Chairs must be close together in a straight line to prevent fingers, hands or arms from getting caught.

IF YOU NOTICE ANYTHING THAT IS NOT RIGHT CONTACT THE PEOPLE IN CHARGE OF THE SET UP TO CORRECT THE PROBLEMS DISCOVERED BEFORE YOUR SHOW.

Suggested Disclaimers

- If you are pregnant, have any head neck or back injuries DO NOT VOLUNTER.
- If selling videos, mention that by volunteering, volunteers are giving permission to be on the video.

Volunteer Safety

- Have your assistant help volunteers up the steps to the stage and also down the steps. Many people have accidents on the stairs.
- Be aware of edges of stage and warn volunteers not to get too close. Erect the imaginary wall to keep volunteers from jumping off the stage.
- Do not let volunteers run around stage. May knock over speakers or fall off stage.
- Be aware of possible phobias. Do not create more, such as fear of flying, snakes, rats and such....
- Be aware of allergies. Bees, bugs, food of any kind, etc. If a volunteer believes they are experiencing it, they will react to it. Also, you might have a diabetic and such.....
- DO NOT let a volunteer experience pain or excessive fear. This may cause heart problems.
- Make sure all volunteers only respond to you and no one else.
- Have volunteers put on the imaginary seat belt to keep them in their seats.

Wake up all volunteers

- You must remove all suggestions at the end of the show and fully 5 count all volunteers awake. Do not let anyone leave the area while still under.
- Work the area after the show to detect any problems with an audience member that may still be under the suggestion.

Misc. Items

- Men, never use a urinal. Use a stall. No one can say you exposed yourself.
- Always keep your hands in the photos. You do not want to be accused of inappropriate touching!
